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SAFETY conscious staff at a Leigh school have developed a clever way of educating pupils about the dangers of the internet.

Information technology and com-munications expert Simon Harris from Southend developed the idea because he said he wants to protect children from risks lurking online. Mr Harris, who is a communica-tions advisor at Saint Pierre School



in Leigh Road, helped create a musi-

cal project using songs and drama. The school has now produced a video on the topic which has now been uploaded to YouTube. Dad-of-one Simon said: "One of

the most rewarding parts of my role is seeing how our children want to contribute to any discussion about online safety.

"Our older pupils are taking a real lead in this with the video, assembly presentations and other printed materials that are shown around the school.

"We have recently introduced a safe and secure email network for year two and above and I am delighted to say that every single pupil is taking responsibility for every message and image that they send. "We have created emails for the
