Early Years - Classical Music

Our Nursery and Reception children were treated to a whole week of classical music activities based on Peter and the Wolf, the musical composition written by Sergei Prokofiev in 1936. Three different musicians visited the school to demonstrate their instruments - an oboist (Christine Orchover, who also teaches piano here at school), a clarinettist (Rachael Harris, who is married to Mr Harris) and a bassoonist (Tony Orchover). Being able to see and hear a professional play the various parts of the original score brought the whole experience to life, and it was a fantastic introduction to the layout of a performing orchestra.







Braintree Museum



Years Four and Five took a trip to Braintree Museum for a day of activities that tied nicely into our History and English curriculums. They had the museum to themselves for the day, and for both year groups the highlight of the visit was a classroom session that transported everyone back in time - special thanks to everyone's parents for organising such detailed costumes in advance of the trip.

Our Year Four pupils were taken back to the 1940's for a fully-authentic lesson as an evacuee child, and everyone in Year Five had to endure a harsh Victorian school experience. The actresses playing the teachers were incredibly convincing, with the 1890's teacher in particular managing to 'scare' the children into absolute silence and diligence at all times - she even pulled out a terrifying wooden device designed to get children to stand up straight.
