We usually try and get our school choir involved in the community all year long - this is in addition to our annual request to accompany the Southend Hospital Christmas Lights Ceremony.




## Une Visite Scolaire

### Paul Klee Art

Our Year Four pupils have been learning about the German artist Paul Klee (1879 - 1940), and they were set the challenge of creating their own 'Klee tribute' in the style of his own expressionism and surrealism.

## Viking Shields

Our Year Three pupils have been making Viking shields as part of their studies about their warfare methods. Unlike other shields that were used around the world at the same time, Viking shields were made of wood with a metal centre.



#### **Shang Dynasty**

Year Five have been making 'Oracle Bones' (甲骨) which were used in the era of the Shang Dynasty for a form of divination - any shoulder bones used would usually come from an ox. People would carve questions onto the bones, and then intense heat would be applied until they cracked under the pressure. The crack pattern would then be interpreted by the diviner to provide an answer about anything from future weather patterns to military endeavours.



#### **Nursery Baking**
