Year 3 and 4 Visit to Abbotts Hall Farm

Year 3 and 4 put their knowledge of biodiversity to the test with their visit to Abbotts Hall farm. It was wonderful to see the students welcome the challenges that the trip presented and how each student has a profound interest and respect for nature. Students took part in a variety of activities including a farm tour, where they learned how to investigate and identify the presence of insects and mammals. They learned about a variety of farming techniques that are used to support the production of organic produce on a large scale, and how insects and wildlife support this natural process. Students most enjoyed the tree walk, mini– beast identification, pond dipping and making bread and butter...in the woods The staff at Abbotts Hall farm where so impressed with the conduct of the year 4 class, complementing their manners and knowledge, stating that they are the 'best students we have had the pleasure of welcoming to our facility'.

We found Solitary Bees, Green Lace bugs and Crane Flies. We learned that Solitary bees to not actually collect pollen. I enjoyed being able to see the insects in such great detail under the microscopes. On our farm tour we learned that some animals live in burrows and we found animal foot prints - this was really fun and quite a surprise. The footprints where from badgers and foxes and rabbits. I enjoyed the pond dipping the most-the pond was really beautiful. I learned that biodiversity is very important to maintain a healthy planet and support the natural process. Something very easy that we can do to support biodiversity is plant pollinating plants. I loved the trip and my favourite activity was bug identification.

Celebrating Harvest in Nursery Class

Nursery Children have enjoyed being introduced to our topic on Harvest, and have learnt the importance of celebrating and sharing what we have with people less fortunate than ourselves. The children have participated in a wide variety of practical activities to explore measure, weight and capacity, using scales, jugs, rulers, measuring tapes and pasta tubes to measure and weigh a large selection of ingredients, fruits and vegetables. The children particularly enjoyed baking their own bread rolls and working together as a team with the Reception class to bake a Harvest loaf, in preparation to take to Crowstone Church. During the week our children where encouraged to use their imaginations to pretend to be budding little farmers, preparing their crops for Harvest. The children enjoyed being physical to dig root vegetables from our very own vegetable patch. Vegetables included carrots, sweet potatoes, turnips, new potatoes, parsnips and cabbages. The children then used these ingredients to strengthen their fine motor skills by chopping, cutting, and spooning, before later making our own vegetable soup to eat with our baked rolls!
